Through faithful adherence to Orthodox Christianity, St. Vladimir's Seminary serves the Church and society through graduate theological education and the ministries of its graduates.

With a firm commitment to the structural unity of the Orthodox Church in North America and to inter-Orthodox cooperation on all levels of Church life, the seminary accomplishes this mission through the following programs and activities:

- Graduate programs for candidates for holy orders
- Graduate programs and special training for scholars and lay workers in the Church
- In-depth theological research and reflection
- Stewardship of the theological resources of the St. Vladimir's library
- Lectures, seminars, workshops, and retreats at the seminary campus and at other locations
- Publication of books, icons, and audio-visual educational materials on the Orthodox Tradition through SVS Press
- Publication of St. Vladimir's Theological Quarterly
- Providing information on Orthodoxy through faculty, bookstore, library, internet services, and other media
- Support of the Church in mission, evangelism, monasticism, family life, social work, and ecumenism
- Service and participation of SVS graduates and students in parish life, pastoral work, scholarship, monastic life, missionary activity, and ecumenism
- Spiritual and practical support of SVS alumni and alumnae
- Interaction with other Orthodox theological schools and centers of theological education and training within and outside the Church
- Participation in professional and service organizations both within and outside the Church

Degree Programs

The seminary offers three degree programs: the Master of Divinity, Master of Arts, and Master of Theology. All programs are accredited by the Association of Theological Schools (ATS). Accreditation presupposes nationally accepted levels of academic excellence, without any interference of ATS in the content of what is taught. Accreditation is in accordance with curricula used in all graduate Orthodox theological schools ("faculties" or "academies") with necessary adaptation to the contemporary needs of Orthodoxy in North America. The seminary's programs are also registered with the New York State Education Department.

- Master of Divinity: a three-year program designed primarily for those called to the priesthood or other positions
 of Church work and service.
- Master of Arts: a two-year program with three possible areas of concentration: general theological studies, Christian education, and liturgical music.
- Master of Theology: a two-year program offering an advanced academic degree in preparation for higher-level studies, teaching, and research.

Seminaries

Student Life

Students coming to the seminary from traditional Orthodox families and parish life are now the exception rather than the rule. Many are older men seeking a "second career" in the Church. They are frequently married with children. Many of them are converts to Orthodoxy. These changes reflect the current realities of Church life and present the seminary with new responsibilities. A large number of candidates now apply from eastern Europe and the former Soviet Union. Financial constraints prevent the seminary from enrolling more students who require scholarships.

Students attend daily chapel services. Liturgical worship is the center of theological education. Pastoral training is an integral and required part of the Master of Divinity degree program. Along with courses in liturgical practice, homiletics, Christian education, and various aspects of pastoral ministry, the students' training includes supervised field work, including a year-long parish assignment, and a second year in hospital ministry or similar work.

Seminary alumni now include more than 33 bishops and more than 700 priests and deacons worldwide.

In the fiscal year 2005, the seminary gave direct scholarship aid valued at \$324,350 to 53 students. All SVS seminarians are now required to have health insurance. A plan is available through the seminary for those who do not otherwise have health insurance.

During the past three years, SVS received from the OCA (through the Church's annual Seminary Appeal): \$105,313. The seminary endowment is currently \$11,515,813, compared to \$10,166,304 in 2002.

Buildings and Facilities

St. Vladimir's Seminary is located on an attractive eleven-acre campus in Crestwood, NY. The seminary has a total of sixteen buildings, including the Three Hierarchs Chapel, three dormitories, seventeen married-student apartments, and eight faculty homes, encompassed within fourteen acres. Two new nine-unit married-student apartment buildings are currently being constructed. They will double the seminary's capacity to house married students from seventeen to thirty-five.

There are currently seventeen married-student apartments on campus. In the 2004-2005 academic year, the seminary subsidized an additional eight married-student apartments off campus in the nearby Crestwood Lake Apartments.

 This facility is located beneath two married-student apartments and houses the maintenance workroom, seminary vehicles, and equipment.

St. Vladimir's Seminary Press

St. Vladimir's Seminary Press has published more than 270 titles and is the largest publisher of Orthodox books in the English language, with nearly 100,000 volumes sold each year.

Since the last All-American Council, SVS Press has developed its series of children's books, continued publication of its "Popular Patristics" series, and is about to launch a new series of basic books on Orthodoxy, "Theological Foundations" ("Orthodoxy 101"). New releases in liturgical music include the long-awaited *Holy Week III*, a new edition of *The Divine Liturgy*, and two new CDs: *The Vigil* and *Chant Traditions*. New faculty publications include a series of New Testament commentaries by the V. Rev. Paul Tarazi and the first two volumes of a projected five-volume series by the Rev. John Behr entitled *The Formation of Christian Theology: The Way to Nicaea* and *The Nicene Faith* (in two parts). New audio CDs include twelve lectures by Dean Emeritus Protopresbyter Thomas Hopko on the Lord's Prayer. A best seller has been *Father Arseny (1893-1973): Priest, Prisoner, Spiritual Father* (trans. Vera Bouteneff), now also available in an audio version.

Seminaries

Outreach

The St. Vladimir's Seminary Alumni Association has increased its activity and outreach since 2002. For the first time in the seminary's history, an alumni reunion was held in October 2004, and the seminary plans to host more reunions in the future. Since 2002 many alumni gatherings have been held at locations all over North America, usually hosted by local alumni and led by a visiting member of the seminary's faculty or staff. The *Alumni News*, a newsletter sent by email to all alumni who have provided their current email address, is sent out each month with updates on campus life as well as personal news of alumni and their families.

In September 2003, St. Vladimir's Seminary hired a full-time communications officer, thus increasing the consistency of communication with its constituency and with Orthodox and secular media via regular press releases and more frequent updates to the seminary's web site, www.svots.edu. Flyers and updates advertising upcoming events at the seminary are regularly mailed to Orthodox churches and parishioners within a 300-mile radius of the seminary. Other events mailings, such as the summer institute brochure mailing, are sent to all past participants and inquirers.

The SVSNews magazine, a four-color, sixteen-page newsletter, is published twice a year, in winter and summer, and is mailed to approximately 6,700 people. A shorter newsletter, the SVSUpdate, is published in early autumn and sent to approximately 18,000 people. Subscriptions to the SVSNews are available by request at no charge.

The seminary's advancement office regularly sends out mailings to current and prospective donors in order to keep them updated on significant events in the life of the seminary, such as student ordinations.

The St. Vladimir's Theological Quarterly has 1,000 subscribers.

The seminary library continues to be a major resource for scholars of Orthodox Christianity and has increased its holdings to 128,000 titles and 350 periodicals.

The seminary offers its resources through lectures, symposia, and institutes held both on and off campus throughout the year. The Liturgical Institute of Music and Pastoral Practice held each June continues to draw approximately 100 participants. The Annual Lenten Retreat, Orthodox Education Day, and the Father Alexander Schmemann Memorial Lecture are also consistently well attended. Special events such as the recent Symposium on the Passion of Christ with Bishop Kallistos (Ware) of Diokleia have drawn as many as 300 people to the seminary's Metropolitan Philip Auditorium. The seminary faculty continues to travel for speaking engagements in the US and abroad. The seminary also offers an extension program so that individuals who are not enrolled as full-time students at the seminary may take courses.

Faculty

Full-time faculty appointments follow procedures employed in other institutions of higher learning. Normal requirements include a formal Orthodox theological education in a recognized Orthodox school, a doctorate (or equivalent) in one's specialty, and a record of service to the Church.

SVS faculty members continue to conduct seminars and retreats in the US and abroad, to publish articles and books, and to participate in various ecclesiastical, ecumenical, and scholarly activities.
