AN ABBREVIATED MOLEBEN TO OUR HOLY AND RIGHTEOUS MOTHER OLGA OF ALASKA

Which may be sung at the end of the Divine Liturgy in thanksgiving for her glorification, and on such other needful occasions as the Rector may direct.

Immediately after the Prayer Behind the Ambo, we sing the troparion and kontakion of our holy and righteous mother Olga of Alaska:

(Troparion, Tone 4) God has chosen a humble mother from Alaska / to be an example for all the servants of God; / he has given us Saint Olga as a helper in afflictions / and as a guide to leading a life of sacrificial love. / Therefore we entreat thee, O holy mother Olga: / pray that we, thy sinful children, may be saved // and rejoice with thee in the Kingdom of Heaven.

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

(Kontakion, Tone 8) Guided by the heavenly light and touched by Christ's rich mercy, / thy loving hands heal the wounds of those hurt in the past. / Thy soft voice encourages all to remain faithful to God, / for the eternal God will give the steadfast a crown of life. / O holy mother Olga visit us with love and reassure us, / that we may accept whatever cross we must bear as chosen by the merciful God // and that, through thy prayers we do the will of God for the salvation of our souls.

And immediately, the refrains of the moleben after the following order, twice:

Clergy: Holy and righteous mother Olga, pray to God for us!

Choir: Holy and righteous mother Olga, pray to God for us!

Clergy: Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit.

Choir: Now and ever, and unto the ages of ages. Amen.

Then we sing the intercessory hymn in Tone 6:

Pray to God for us, / O holy and righteous mother Olga, / for with fervor we run to thee, // swift helper and intercessor for our souls.

THE TRIPLE LITANY

Deacon: Have mercy on us, O God, according to Thy great mercy, we pray Thee, hearken and have mercy.

Choir: Lord, have mercy. (3x)

Deacon: Again we pray for our Metropolitan Tikhon, for our Archbishop Daniel, and for our all brethren in Christ.

Choir: Lord, have mercy. (3x)

Deacon: Again we pray for this country, its civil authorities and armed forces, and for all who in faith and piety dwell in it.

Choir: Lord, have mercy. (3x)

Deacon: Again we pray for mercy, life, peace, health, salvation, visitation, pardon, and prosperity for the servants of God, our diocesan seminarians, and for the brethren of this holy temple.

Choir: Lord, have mercy. (3x)

Deacon: Again we pray that he will keep this city (or town, or village) and this holy church, and every city and countryside, from famine, pestilence, earthquake, flood, fire, the sword, foreign invasion, and civil war; that our good God, who loves mankind, will be gracious and conciliatory, and turn away and dispel all the wrath stirred up against us and all sickness, and deliver us from His righteous chastisement which impendeth against us, and have mercy on us.

Choir: Lord, have mercy. (3x)

Deacon: Again we pray that the Lord God may hearken unto the voice of the supplication of us sinners, and have mercy on us.

Choir: Lord, have mercy. (3x)

Priest: Hear us, O God our Savior, thou hope of all the ends of the earth, and those that be far off upon the sea, and be merciful, be merciful, O Master, regarding our sins, and have mercy on us. For thou art a merciful God who lovest mankind, and unto Thee do we send up glory: to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, now and ever, and unto ages of ages.

Choir: Amen.

THE SUPPLICATORY PRAYER

Deacon: To our holy and righteous mother Olga, let us all pray:

Choir: Holy and righteous mother Olga, pray to God for us!

Priest: O righteous mother Olga, helper of orphans, mother who bore thy cross! With thy generous right hand make bestowal upon us who now pray to thee, and ask the all-merciful God, Whose very name is love, that He grant us rich mercies. Be thou a good helper unto mothers who give birth unto children; a holy preserver of purity and love within marriage; a wise nurturer of little children and youths; a compassionate comforter of the orphaned and sorrowful; a sympathetic healer of those who are tempest-tossed by sins; a mighty defender of those subjected to trials by their enemies; and a merciful mediator before God and the all-pure Theotokos for all who ask thine aid. And pray thou all the more, O holy favorite of God, that we be given the grace of the all-holy Spirit, that preserved thereby and saved unceasingly in this life, with thee we may glorify the all-merciful Redeemer, our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, to Whom is due glory, together with His all-good Father and His holy and all-compassionate Spirit, unto the ages of ages.

Choir: Amen.

And the prayer being concluded, we all sing at once:

THE MAGNIFICATION

We magnify thee, O holy and righteous Olga, and we honor thy holy memory, O healer of those in afflictions and loving intercessor before the merciful God.

Upon the conclusion of the magnification, the clergy return to the altar while the choir sings "Blessed be the Name of the Lord" (3x) and Psalm 33, as usual: and the dismissal is then made.
