

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
Three important facts about OCA geography. Fact 1. Compared to general US population, the members of Orthodox Churches are concentrated in certain geographic areas. 45% of them live in five states New York (14% of all Orthodox adherents), California (10%), Illinois (8%), Pennsylvania (7%), Massachusetts (6%) But only 29% of US population live in these five states But geography of OCA membership is different. 46% of OCA adherents live in five states: Alaska (14%), Pennsylvania (11%), Ohio (7%), California (7%), New York (6%).



Fact 2. Members of Orthodox Churches are "urban" people: 77% of them are in Metropolitan areas of 1,000,000+ compared to only 54% among US general population.
<u>But OCA is less "urban"</u> than the other Orthodox Churches


% of Church members living in Metropolitan areas of more than 1,000,000 population




Fact 3. During 2000-2010: + 15% growth in total number of Orthodox parishes and monasteries in USA.

OCA: only +4% net-increase (from 549 to 571 parishes)



2010 Religious Congregations Membership Study Copyright by Alexei D. Krindatch US nationwide, during 2000-2010, the total number of parishes and monastic communities that belong to the various Assembly's jurisdictions increased from 1,689 to 1,936: +15% growth. During 2000-2010, OCA became much more geographically widespread. It "entered" 90 new counties while "dropped" its parishes from 22 counties. That is, +28% growth in geographic presence (240 counties in 2000, 308 - in 2010)

- 11,000+ randomly selected religious congregations representing 32 of the country's largest denominations and faith traditions completed standard questionnaires
- FACT 2010 surveys were sent to all GOA, OCA, AOCA parishes. 370 parishes completed questionnaires – 30% return. Including: 123 OCA, 160 GOA 85 AOCA parishes.

Fact 1 Compared to Roman Catholic and Protestant Churches, membership of Orthodox Churches is different in several ways:

- Members of Orthodox churches are better educated: Orthodox parishes have higher % of persons with college degree than Catholic and Protestant congregations
- Compared to Roman-Catholics and Protestants, members of Orthodox churches spend significantly longer time commuting to their churches
- Orthodox parishes are less "female" than Roman Catholic parishes or Protestant congregations








Fact 4 Compared to Roman Catholic and Protestant Churches, the Orthodox Churches do not communicate much with religiously "others:" the level of ecumenical involvement of Orthodox parishes is significantly lower than among Roman Catholic parishes or **Protestant congregations**






<u>Fact 5</u> Reportedly, worship in Orthodox parishes is more "powerful" than in Roman Catholic and Protestant churches


% of parishes / congregations reporting that following describe their week-end worship service "very well"




<u>Fact 6.</u> With regard to personal religious practices of their members, OCA churches are more "relaxed" than AOCA but stricter than GOA churches
 % of parishes reporting that they place "a lot of emphasis" on following personal and family religious practices




Fact 7 Financial health of Orthodox Parishes is worse compared to Roman-Catholic parishes and Protestant Congregations


"How would you describe current (2010) financial health of your parish / congregation?" % of parishes / congregations reporting:




Compared to GOA and OCA churches, Antiochian parishes report better financial situation. "How would you describe current (2010) financial health of your parish?"

% of parishes / congregations reporting:






Fact 8 US Orthodox parishes are as involved in recruiting new members as Catholic parishes or Mainline Protestant churches. But they lag far behind Evangelicals churches.
