

Metropolitan Tikhon addresses Orlando shootings in archpastoral letter, statement

SYOSSET, NY – On Monday, June 13, 2016, His Beatitude, Metropolitan Tikhon issued an Archpastoral Letter to the hierarchs, clergy, monastics and faithful of the Orthodox Church in America and a Public Statement in response to the tragic shootings that occurred in Orlando, FL on Sunday, June 12.

"The hope of the Church is that all people should be saved and come to know the love of God," Metropolitan Tikhon wrote. "It is therefore heartbreaking to see the triumph of evil and destruction on this earth. We have witnessed yet another manifestation of the brokenness and division wrought by the evil one in the tragic shooting in Orlando, the worst mass murder in United States history."

Holy Synod issues "Sincerely Held Religious Beliefs Regarding Marriage" document

SYOSSET, NY – The Holy Synod of Bishops of the Orthodox Church in America approved a statement, "Sincerely Held Religious Beliefs Regarding Marriage," on June 16, 2016 to articulate the basic and fundamental beliefs of the OCA regarding marriage in terms that could be understood and applied by federal, state, and local governmental officials without the necessity of any probing inquiry or interpretation that might require them to transgress limitations imposed on them by the First Amendment to the US Constitution and by related federal or state legislation, such as the Religious Freedom Restoration Act of 1993. The document is descriptive of marriage in the Orthodox understanding and also establishes guidelines regarding the usage of church property in related respects.

Holy and Great Council convenes in Crete

CRETE – The Holy and Great Council concluded with the concelebration of the Divine Liturgy on June 26, 2016, at which His All-Holiness, Ecumenical Patriarch Bartholomew of Constantinople presided. The closing session was held one day earlier.



According to the Council's press office, Patriarch Bartholomew, "expressed his joy for the willing and positive response of the Local Autocephalous Orthodox Churches in attendance." The Churches of Antioch, Russia, Bulgaria and Georgia did not participate. They also "expressed their confidence that the Council opens a new era of conciliarity for the Orthodox Church to express its positions on the contemporary problems of man in the world.... His All-Holiness added that conciliarity is another word that characterizes the unity, holiness, catholicity and apostolicity of the Church."

Bishop Alexander enthroned as second Bishop of Dallas

DALLAS, TX – His Grace, Bishop Alexander was enthroned as the second Bishop of Dallas and the South at Saint Seraphim Cathedral here during the second weekend of June 2016.

The celebration opened on Friday afternoon, June 10, with a reception, after which Great Vespers was celebrated. His Beatitude, Metropolitan Tikhon and several members of the Holy Synod of Bishops joined clergy and faithful from across the diocese and beyond.

On Saturday, June 11, Metropolitan Tikhon presided at the celebration of the Hierarchical Divine Liturgy, after which Metropolitan Tikhon presented the archpastoral staff to Bishop Alexander.

Canonically elected by the Holy Synod on March 29, 2016, Bishop Alexander succeeds His Eminence, Archbishop Dmitri, who in retirement fell asleep in the Lord at the age of 87 on August 28, 2011.

Established in the late 1970s, the Diocese of the South has grown to number nearly 80 parishes and missions and three monastic communities spanning 14 states.

The keynote address was delivered by Father Ivan Moody, ISOCM’s Board Chair, who explored how beauty, prayer, and music are inherent to our Orthodox Christian ethos and liturgical experience.

His Grace, Bishop Paul of Chicago and His Eminence, Metropolitan Elia of Oulu, Finland concelebrated the Divine Liturgy on Sunday, at which participants sang the responses.

SOUTH CANAAN, PA – Saint Tikhon’s Monastery Press recently released its latest title, *Saint Tikhon of Moscow: Instructions & Teachings for the American Orthodox Faithful (1898-1907)*. The volume features his sermons and other writings, newly translated and edited by Alex Maximov and Dr. David C. Ford. His words and sermons form an engaging “archpastoral diary” of sorts, detailing major aspects of Church life in the late 19th and early 20th centuries while detecting similarities and differences between that era and our own.
