Therefore, O <u>Xen</u>ia, thou appearest to the <u>world</u> as a fool, preaching <u>Christ</u>, the <u>Wis</u>dom of God; and en<u>light</u>ened by his grace, *** thou teachest all to abstain from the <u>van</u>ity of the world.

Thou hast acquired perfect poverty, thou hast cast off all <u>world</u>ly thoughts, and hast sacrificed thy mind to <u>God</u>, like the <u>wid</u>ow's mite; and so to men thou ap<u>pear</u>est a fool; yet we know thee to be <u>wis</u>er than the wise. Therefore, we <u>ask instruction of thee</u>: Enlighten our mind with thy splendor, O all-wise <u>Xen</u>ia, *** driving away the gloom of ignorance.

and from thy very swaddling clothes hast thou gone to dwell in the <u>wil</u>derness.


